

Good Morning Everyone,

CURFEW

With the approach of Hurricane Dorian, the regulation of movement of people and equipment will promote a prompt response by emergency and disaster relief personnel.

Therefore, to promote the safety to persons and property, a curfew is declared by Mayor Jones within the territorial jurisdiction of the Town of Pine Knoll Shores beginning at 7:00 p.m., September 5, 2019 until further notice. The other Bogue Banks towns all have/will have curfew orders in place beginning at the same time. Possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages off one's own premises is prohibited for the duration of the curfew.

During this curfew, there shall be no travel within the Town of Pine Knoll Shores except for the following persons acting in the line of and within the scope of their respective duties:

- Emergency management personnel
- Law enforcement officers
- Firefighters
- Commissioners and public employees
- Emergency medical services members
- Doctors, nurses, employees of hospitals and other medical facilities
- Military personnel whether state or federal
- Public utility personnel
- Members of the news media
- State, local, and federal officials with emergency management authority
- Disaster relief personnel
- Crews working under contract with the Town of Pine Knoll Shores to clear storm debris.

This curfew shall continue from day to day as long as the declared state of emergency exists, or until modified or rescinded.

CARTERET COUNTY SHELTER

Carteret County will have a pet friendly shelter open as of 12 noon today at Newport Middle School located at 500 E. Chatham St, Newport, NC. This shelter will be pet friendly for cats and dogs only. Only pets up to date on their rabies vaccination will be accepted. Residents bringing their cats or dogs will need to bring a kennel/crate, food and water for the pets, food and water dishes, leash, medications, and toys or other comfort care items.
